President's Message

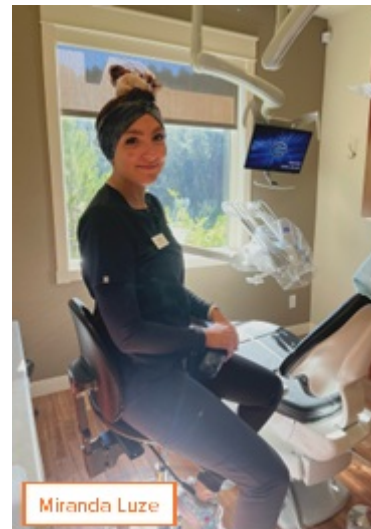
Greetings, Alumni of WDTC!
